## **Paralyzed Veterans to Benefit from 5<sup>th</sup> Annual All Patriots Poker Run Sept. 19, 2009**

Denver, Colorado — The Mountain States Chapter of the Paralyzed Veterans of America (MSCPVA) is honored to participate in the 5<sup>th</sup> Annual All Patriots Poker Run, hosted by the Combat Veterans Motorcycle Association (CVMA).

On September 19, 2009, MSCPVA will team up with CVMA to put on this popular and fun local event. Over 100 riders will ride to four stops originating in Denver and traveling through the foothills. Riders will collect their poker cards at each stop and play their hand at the final stop. Registration begins at 9 am at Arvada VFW (5340 Marshall St., Arvada, CO). Entry fees are \$25 for riders with a passenger and \$15 for solo riders. The stops include:

- Cactus Jack's – 4651 Highway 73, Evergreen,
- Ranch Grill – 19523 N. Turkey Creek Rd., Morrison
- Susie's Bar and Grill – 17999 W. Colfax Ave., Golden

The final stop at Susie's Bar and Grill will include live music, BBQ, and prizes from noon to 6pm.

Proceeds from the event go to the MSCPVA to benefit paralyzed veterans living in the Rocky Mountain region. MSCPVA spends thousands of hours helping members, fellow disabled veterans, their families and other persons with disability recover from the physical loss associated with spinal cord injury and disease. The public is invited to attend this community event to learn more about the Paralyzed Veterans of America, and the programs and services provided to their members.
