Department of Veterans Affairs and Paralyzed Veterans of America Host Breakfast Fundraiser for 2010 National Veterans Wheelchair Games

Denver, Colorado - The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) Eastern Colorado Health Care System, in conjunction with the Mountain States Chapter of Paralyzed Veterans of America, are hosting a breakfast fundraiser for the 2010 National Veterans Wheelchair Games. The event takes place on Saturday, February 27, 2010 at from 7 to 9:30 a.m. at Applebee's restaurant on South Colorado Blvd. The all-you-can-eat pancake and sausage breakfast costs \$7 per person, with proceeds going to support the upcoming Wheelchair Games.

The National Veterans Wheelchair Games, which will take place in Denver July 4-9, 2010, is the largest annual wheelchair sporting event of its kind in the world. The Games will attract more than 500 veteran athletes to participate in seventeen sports in venues located throughout the Denver metro area. In addition to producing national and world-class champions, the Games provide opportunities for newly disabled veterans to gain sports skills and be exposed to other wheelchair athletes. In past years, one-quarter of the competitors have never before participated in any type of organized wheelchair sports competition.

The Games will showcase Denver and Colorado, as the event, now in its 30th year, takes place in our state for the first time ever.
