Paralyzed Veterans Supports Junior Wheelchair Sports Camp

Denver, Colorado — The Paralyzed Veterans of America Mountain States Chapter (MSCPVA) is excited to be involved in this year's Colorado Junior Wheelchair Sports Camp (CJWSC), which will be held at Aurora Central High School Aurora, Colorado from June 7-11, 2010. The camp is designed for physically disabled children who use a wheelchair to compete in sports.

This year, there will be over 100 kids from Colorado, Kansas and Wyoming, in grades 1 - 12, competing in over 10 sport activities, including tennis, basketball, archery, rugby, power soccer and Frisbee golf to name a few. The CJWSC allows for disabled youth to experience a day camp similar to their able-bodied peers.

Mary Carpenter, who has been coordinating this event since 1984, continues to do so for the love of the children and what the camp contributes to their lives. She said that the camp allows for kids to see other kids using wheelchairs and be able to compete in sports and succeed. It is also rewarding for Ms. Carpenter to see former campers return later in life and become counselors to the younger participants.

"It is great to be involved in this event again this year," said Mr. James W. Sack, MSCPVA President. "We've been supporters for many, many years and look forward to taking on an even larger role in future camps."

In addition to MSCPVA's contributions, other organizational donations, grants and volunteers support allow children and their families to enjoy the camp free of charge. Local community based organizations help supply the necessary equipment. MSCPVA is grateful to have the opportunity to get more involved in this incredible program as it continues to grow.
